Approval-Department of Transportation Grant Drawdown Request.

Teecee Barrett, Deputy Clerk, presented draw down request #2 for the Department of Transportation Rural Roads Project grant. Commissioner Hall moved to approve the request and allow the Chairman to sign, seconded by Commissioner Hall and unanimously carried.

Approval-Fairgrounds Exhibit Hall Project Final Closure and Release of Retainer.

Brian Edwards, County Engineer, made the recommendation to the Board to approve the completion of the Exhibit Hall at the Park County Fairgrounds and release any retainer fee to Synergy Construction. Edwards said the project is complete and has had no feedback from the public or sub-contractors. After general discussion Commissioner Livingston moved to take the recommendation of the staff to close the project and release any retainer monies to Synergy Construction, seconded by Commissioner French and unanimously carried.

Approval-Fee Reduction Requests.

Echo Renner, Events Coordinator, presented three requests to the Board for fee reductions.

-United Blood Services-Powell Community Blood Drives 2015 and 2016 -First Baptist Church of Powell-Community Thanksgiving Dinner

Both entities will still be required to show proof of insurance and pay a deposit. Commissioner Livingston moved to waive the usage fees for United Blood Services and First Baptist Church of Powell for the said events, seconded by Commissioner French and unanimously carried.

Renner also presented a request from Heart Mountain Roller Derby. They would like to hold practices in the new exhibit hall over the next six to eight weeks, for a few hours each week. They proposed to pay \$10.00 per hour of use. After general discussion Commissioner French moved to allow the Heart Mountain Roller Derby to use the facility for six weeks on a trial basis, with a fee of \$50.00 per use. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hall and carried three to one with Livingston voting against as there is not an approved fee schedule for hourly rentals.

Approve-TANF Agreement for Northwest College.

Shaunna Romero, Executive Assistant, presented the approved TANF contract for a signature approval. Commissioner Hall moved to sign the TANF contract for Northwest College, seconded by Commissioner Livingston and unanimously carried.

*Commissioner Livingston excused himself from the meeting.

Approve-Agreement for Road and Bridge Department Cody Maintenance District Shop Expansion Project.

Brian Edwards, County Engineer, presented the agreement with Filner Construction for the Road and Bridge shop expansion in the Cody District. The agreement is in the amount of \$578,330.00 which includes both bid alternates. Commissioner French moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Commissioner Hall and unanimously carried.

Approve-Out of State Travel.

Echo Renner, Events Coordinator, presented two out of state conferences that she would like to attend. The first one is Rocky Mountain Associations of Fairs Convention in Layton, Utah, November 11th-14th. Renner said the cost will be \$686.00 to attend as the Fair Board paid for her registration fee. The other is the International Association of Fairs and Expositions in Las Vegas, Nevada, November 29th through December 3rd. The cost for the Nevada conference will be \$2000.00 including her airfare, registration, and hotel. After general discussion Commissioner Hall moved to approve Renner's travel to the two conferences, seconded by Commissioner French and unanimously carried.

Board Interviews-Park County Historic Preservation Board.

The Board interviewed two applicants for the current vacancy on the Park County Historic Preservation Board, Brian Beauvais and Richard Jones. After the interviews Commissioner French moved to appoint Brian Beauvais to the Historic Preservation Board, seconded by Commissioner Hall and unanimously carried.

Recess for Lunch.

Approve-Contract for New Gas Service to Demaris House.

Lynn Houze, Cody Heritage Museum Vice President, presented the Black Hills Energy Landlord Contract to the Board for approval. After general discussion Commissioner Hall moved to approve the Landlord Contract with Black Hills Energy and allow the Chairman to sign, with the County agreeing to pay for the installation of the new gas service with funds from the Buildings and Grounds budget. The motion was seconded by Commissioner French and unanimously carried.

Approve-Recommendations for Powell Landfill Loader.

Tim Waddell, Solid Waste Manager, reviewed the bids received for the loader and recommended the bid be awarded to Titan Machinery of Billings in the amount of \$175,713.00. Commissioner Hall moved to accept the recommendation of the staff and award the bid to Titan Machinery for the CASE 821F in the amount of \$175,713.00, seconded by Commissioner French and unanimously carried.

Commissioner French moved to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Hall and unanimously carried.
